The set includes a miniature model of the Maybach engine, which can be displayed next to the armoured model or placed in the tank under the service hatch. The model has movable wheels and chains consisting of many links. While having fun, you can drive the tank and watch the chain drive work! The replica tank ammunition supplied can be stored inside the vehicle. The hatches can be opened and there is space underneath for standard COBI figures.
