This 1:35 scale model of the DUKW amphibious vehicle was developed as part of the collection published to mark the 80th anniversary of the Allied landings in Normandy and bears the official logo of the organisers of the celebrations taking place in France! Our model consists of 508 high-quality elements and includes imprints that will not wear off even with intensive use. The model is equipped with swivelling wheels, which significantly increase the attractiveness of the set. A transport vehicle cannot function without a load. That's why the American soldier at the wheel of the amphibious vehicle has plenty of accessories that every building block fan will love to use. Bazooka, Browning, Garand, Thomson and M1 rifles and binoculars are not all. The cargo hold also contains crates, barrels, canisters and a spare wheel. The whole thing is complemented by two large barbed wire imitations. The set is sure to delight history and military technology enthusiasts, whatever their age. Thanks to the intuitive instructions, assembly is easy and fun. Build the story brick by brick and get ready for the landing! The official set from the D-Day collection is a combination of passion, history and fun! The DUKW, also known as the "Duck", was an amphibious transport vehicle that was mainly used by the US Army during the Second World War. Production began in 1942 and it was based on the design of a GMC lorry and had an additional drive that enabled it to move on both land and water. It had a characteristic flat bow that made it easier to float. The DUKW was frequently used for sea landings, land operations and transport in flooded areas. Its ability to move on water and on land made it a very versatile vehicle in combat conditions. The vehicle was powered by a powerful petrol engine, which enabled a top speed of around 80 km/h on land and 10 km/h in the water. It offered space for up to 25 people or 2.25 tonnes of cargo. After the end of the Second World War, the DUKW continued to be used by American troops in conflicts such as the Korean and Vietnam Wars. It was also exported to other countries and used for civilian purposes such as maritime tourism and rescue. DUKW is considered an icon of the Second World War.
